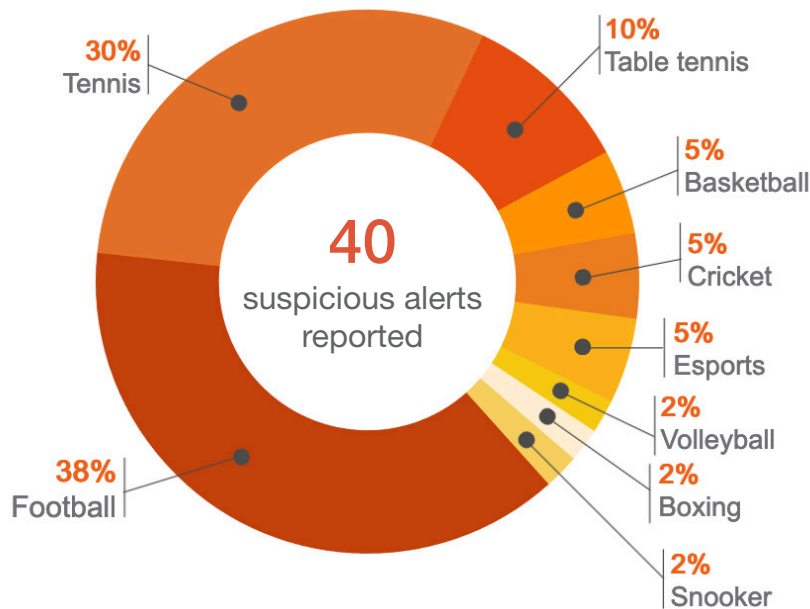
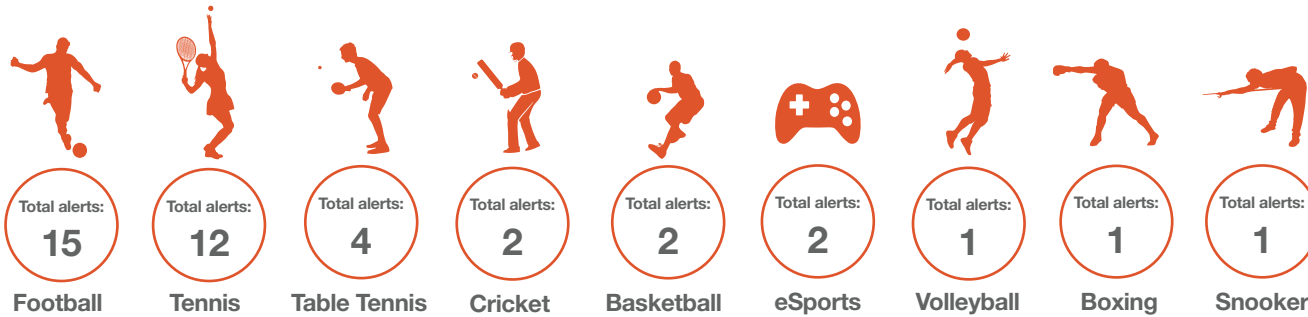


IBIA reported a total of **40 sports betting alerts** to relevant authorities concerning **9 sports** during Q1 2023*

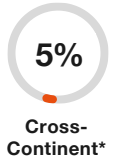

The Q1 2023 total is a decrease of

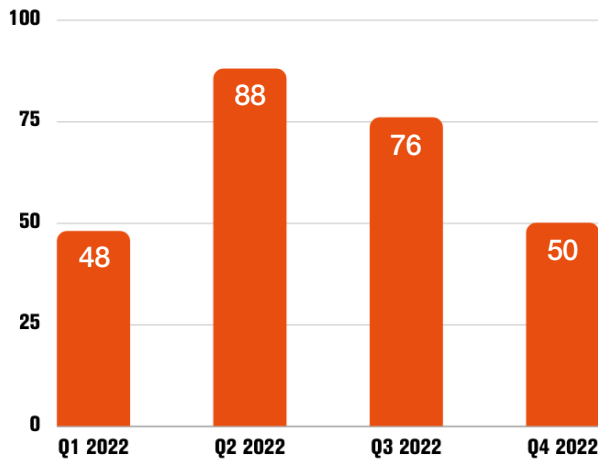
- 20%

when compared to the Q1 total of 2022 (48 alerts)

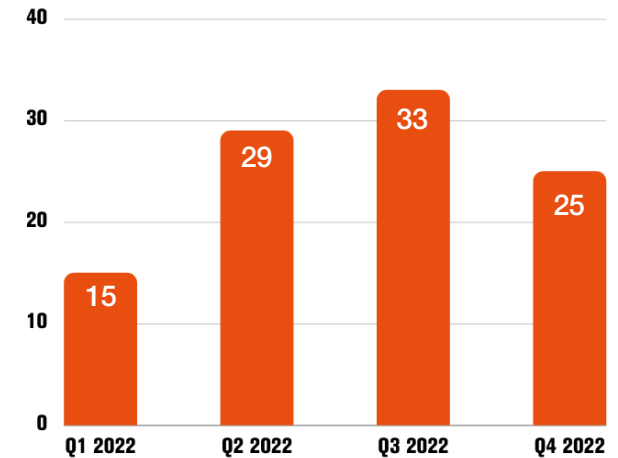

reported in Q1 2023



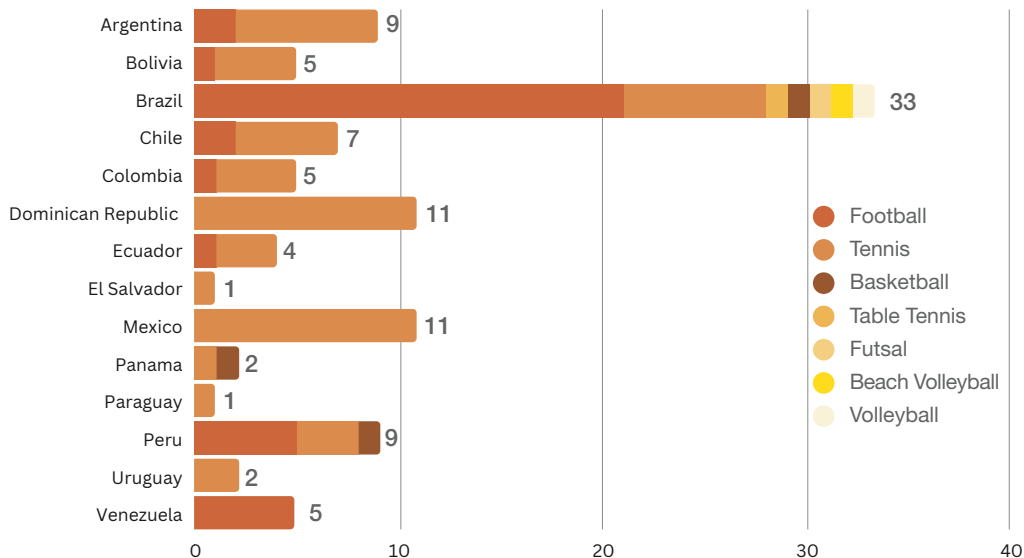
The 12 tennis alerts reported in Q1 2023 represent a greater than **50% decrease** when **compared to the average quarterly figure in 2022**.

Of the 12 tennis alerts, three matches were provided to the International Tennis Integrity Agency (ITIA) as intelligence reports as they do not relate to events sanctioned by the main tennis tours. Some of the players engaged in those events may, however, fall within the scope of the body's Tennis Anti-Corruption Program (TACP).

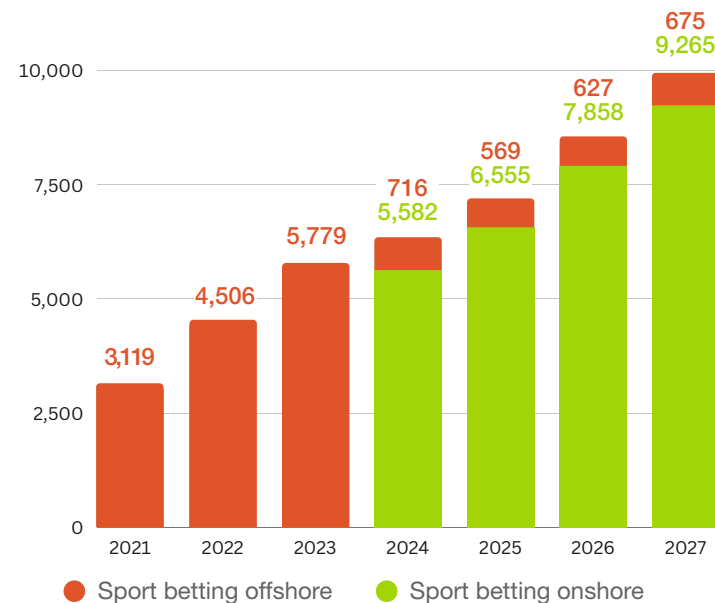


% breakdown of the alerts reported in Latin America during 2018-2022



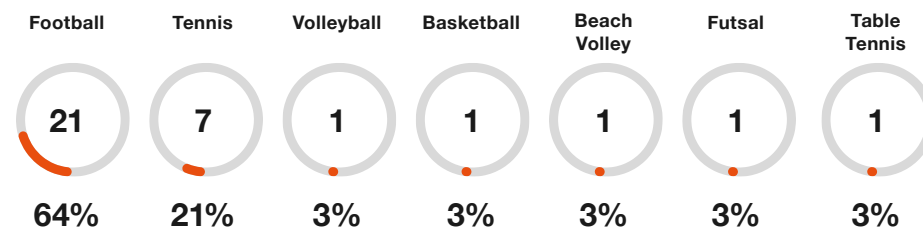
